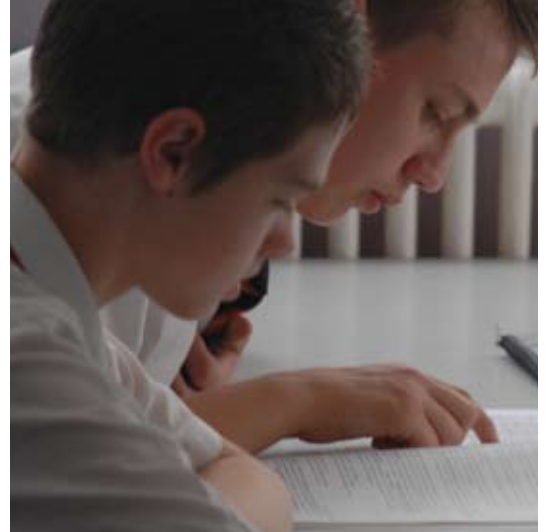

Kemnal Technology College is an 11-18 boys comprehensive school (with a mixed sixth form) in the London Borough of Bromley, on the Bexley/Kent borders and is within a short distance of Lewisham and Greenwich.

Kemnal has moved a considerable way forward over the last few years. The roll has increased to 1250 and this year has seen another record breaking set of examination results at all levels.

Parents and the Community

Over the years, Kemnal has forged links with several schools and companies. Teachers and parents are working closely to provide the best support for the students. Kemnal organises inter-school tournaments and also hosts Primary Schools Bromley sports tournament involving 64 primary schools.

Extra curricular activities

At Kennal we have a well designed Enrichment programme available to all KS3. Year 7 students have the choice of a trip to Downe Activity Centre to enhance team building activities or they can take part in Art, Technology, ICT or Humanities projects.

Year 8 students participate in a variety of workshops in Keeping Safe, Anti Social Behaviour, Trading Standards and Science Magic.

Year 9 students have a Healthy Body day, where they have a cookery workshop and then try out different sports. They also have a Technology day, where they can build tracks for a mountain bike stunt team.

In Years 10 and 11 we concentrate more on the careers aspect with Dragons Pen, Industry Challenge day, Army Challenge day and Theatre groups for Enterprise.

Year 12 students participate in a Business Dynamics project and have work experience for one week in the summer.

Technology College

As a Technology College, we promote an educational culture which is scientific, technological, enterprising and vocational. We build and extend partnerships with industry and commerce to support our curriculum. Technology influences all aspects of college life, varying between project based lessons and extra-curricular activities.



Training School Status

As a Training School we have a number of trainee teachers in college which means that your son will often have two adults in the classroom to support his learning. Experienced staff who support the trainees are able to develop mentoring and coaching skills which supports their own professional development. Being a Training School also attracts additional funding, which can be used for the benefit of the college and its students. The biggest project for 2009-10 is a new, state of the art training centre which will benefit students, staff and the local community.

Learning Support

Kemnal's Special Educational Needs Policy covers every aspect of the College and is monitored by Heads of Department and the Director of Learning Support. Our most able students are given extension work and enhancement classes while the College has a wide range of strategies to support students with special educational needs. This includes small group tuition in literacy and numeracy, social skills sessions, mentoring and counselling. The Learning Support Department has a borough-recognised plan of action and together we support students with behavioural difficulties.

Admissions

The Governors of Kemnal Technology College are committed to a continuing policy of open admission to the College where all of the places are awarded without any selection or discrimination.

All Year 11 students wishing to continue to Year 12 are encouraged to do so provided that they meet the entry demands of the course they wish to study. There will be a minimum of 20 places available for external applicants, both girls and boys, on the same basis.
